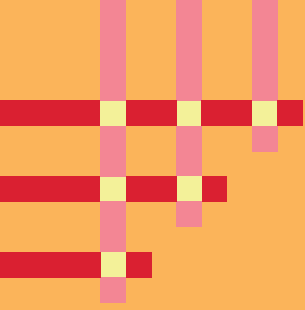

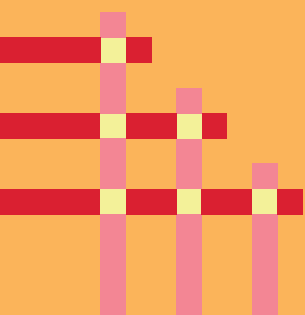

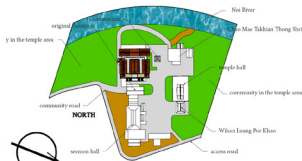

THE DESIGN OF THE CLOISTER AND PRAYER HALL AT WAT THA CHANG (WISET CHAI CHAN DISTRICT)

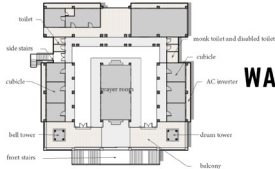
To make the architecture look outstanding and elegant, the cloisters and prayer halls of Wat Tha Chang were designed using **3 principles**.

- 1 Use the proportion of **Ayutthaya** architecture, which is related to the design using the golden ratio in the shape of space, stacking the roof.
- 2 Make it simple and easy to take care of reducing the stucco decoration with a **Art Thai pattern**. Turn to use **terracotta tiles**, which are local materials of Angthong Province and are of good quality.
- 3 Use warm colors such as brown and pale yellow to create a **relaxed, approachable feeling**.

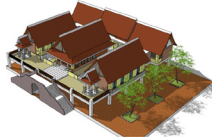

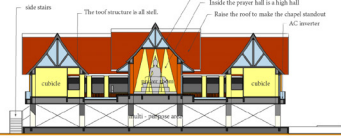

This Goowatin Islam mosque waterfront pavilion is used as a viewpoint area for sitting and relaxing, as a pier and as a mosque's landmark

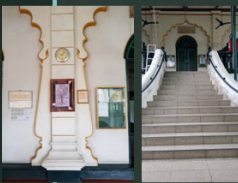
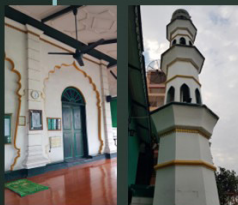
DESIGN CONCEPT

Bringing some important elements of the mosque's architectural identity into the design, for example: Stucco line of the entrance arch, Stucco lotus pattern of the minaret, Dome of the minarets, Patterned grooving of mosque pillars, Stucco cornices of mosque pillars

Because this mosque is ancient. But the area around the mosque has built many buildings that cover the mosque, so this pavilion is designed to be distinctive, elegant and unique to be a destination for passers-by.

In order for this pavilion to be in harmony with the various buildings within the mosque, therefore choosing colors that have the same tone as the mosque building, i.e. white, green and gold

Because the structure of the pavilion is on the river. Bringing the identity of the architectural art within the mosque, some important Chao Phraya River. But the stairs and the terrace are on the structure of the bank. Therefore, the design of the structure of this pavilion had to separate the structure between the structure on the river and the structure on the bank, to prevent subsidence of different structures
